## **TKE Board of Advisors Report – October 8, 2015** –*Mark Witthar, Board of Advisors Chairman*

**Dear Fraters,**

Another year has passed and there is much to report at Delta Nu. As I reflect back on the past eight years as Chairman of the Delta Nu Board of Advisors, we have made some very significant progress. When I was asked to join the Board as Chairman the Chapter was broke and membership had dwindled. The house was in terrible shape and we needed to rush more effectively. Since that time there have been so many events and so many people involved it is just amazing to me. I say this to point out the power of this organization, not to call out anything I have done personally. Were it not for Fraters like Pete Greve and Brad Shelton many of the things that have been accomplished would never have happened. I am thankful we have so many men who see the value in helping younger Delta Nu Tekes learn incredibly important “life lessons” that help all of us as we progress on our personal journeys.

Some important things are happening that will continue to change Delta Nu for the long term. Frater Brad Shelton has embarked on a very aggressive plan to pay off the chapter house. He has developed an innovative financing plan that asks alumni for a donation that is paid back over a 5 year period. The alumni are basically providing an interest free loan to the chapter. To date **Frater Shelton has raised over \$105,000** to retire the debt on the house! If you are interested in participating, please talk to Frater Shelton about the details. By taking this action, we can free up cash flow for important longer term projects on the property as well as financing scholarship programs for future Delta Nu Tekes!

Now on to active chapter news.....we have taken 19 new pledges this semester. While that number is lower than the incredible numbers we took last fall we are still making progress. The active chapter including pledges will be at 80 members! New members are the lifeblood of our fraternity and the Board of Advisors has been working with the active chapter and the International Fraternity to help improve our rush techniques. Things have changed a great deal since we left Northwest and we must change with the times to be successful.

I would also like to touch briefly on new member training. The Board of Advisors has been working closely with the active chapter to modify our approach to new members with a focus on learning about the fraternity and each other; things that we spent a great deal of time on when we joined many years ago.

I also want to welcome a new Board member – Frater John Moore. He is taking on a new role related to chapter management. Frater Moore, in addition to be a Top Teke, brings a wealth of business expertise to the Board that will be incredibly helpful. I would ask that anyone who wishes to help support the chapter by volunteering their time, please

A big thank you to a couple of generous Fraters! They have recently contributed to this cause, providing a sizable increase in the TKE Actives Members Scholarship balance.

This puts the scholarship in a new category and I am looking for ways to leverage this even more and discussion various options with the NW Foundation Board that manages these funds. The generous gifts were both onetime gifts. My goal is to focus on reoccurring gifts, either on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis.

The bowling event continues to be the primary fund raiser for this scholarship. At that event last winter, we provided pledge cards for everyone to declare the intent to pledge reoccurring gifts. Unfortunately I only received a few. If you would like to help, it only takes a few dollars and a few of us to make a commitment that will make a difference for future TKE's. With the focus and increase on GPA at the chapter level, I expect to see an increase in these numbers for fall.

In May of this year the Scholarship officially became an endowed scholarship; thanks to all of you who have generously supported the PJG Memorial Scholarship at Northwest!

The name was changed to Peter J. Greve Memorial TKE Alumni Scholarship Fund. The name change reflects Pete's intent to promote our University through the efforts of Delta Nu alums of TKE and Pete for his untiring work to accomplish this before he passed on to the chapter eternal.

We should all be proud of the high school seniors who have benefitted with this financial assistance. As evaluators will testify, deciding from the applicants is tough due to grades, accomplishments, and humanitarian and community involvement. This was just in high school; forewarning of what to expect when they hit the campus of Northwest Missouri State University and after graduation.

Again this year evaluators awarded two Scholarships, **Madison Leader** of Exira-Elk Horn Kimballton (Iowa) High School was nominated by Delta Nu Frater Max Knudsen, scroll 779. Ranking #2 in her class, Madison is majoring in Ag. Business; focusing on "financial and the planning side," she would "...like to come back to my hometown and start a career and family..." She wants to give back to her community and raise her family in the Exira-Elk Horn Kimballton School District.

**Karolyn Johnson** of Elkhorn (Nebraska) South High School was nominated by Delta Nu alum, Bruce Barlow, scroll 533. She was named an outstanding student in her sophomore year. She is best described by her teachers: Karolyn is the rare mix of intellect, poise, maturity, calm demeanor, and 100% reliability." "disciplined, determined, and genuinely passionate about caring for others." At an early age Karolyn discovered her "genuine compassion for young children." She plans on becoming an elementary school teacher; her goal at Northwest, to become the greatest teacher she can become.

Watch for more articles this Fall as we report on both Madison and Karly as they adjust to life on campus; plus last year's Scholarship winner, Ethan Moss, as he tells of his experience as a member of TKE.

The TKE Alumni of Northwest Missouri State University Scholarship is for \$1000; available to graduating seniors (male or female). To be eligible, applicants must have maintained a high school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above from ninth grade through the first semester of their senior year. The applicant must be an accepted entering freshman by Northwest Missouri State University and nominated by a TKE alumnus. No specific major is required.

TKE alumni serve as evaluators and will review student transcripts, supporting information, and recommendation letters in their deliberations. Applications are due February 1 each year for consideration.

## Capital Improvements Fund Report - Keith Jorgensen, DN#438 Capital Improvements Fund Chairman



As the chairman of the Capital Improvements Committee, I am pleased to announce 3 new programs all directed to help the Delta Nu Board of Advisors and the Active Chapter.

**The first effort, the Mortgage Reduction Program,** has been established to reduce the amount of the loan balance and to become self-funding by eliminating the bank mortgage. This program calls for 20 investors to loan \$10,000 each to the Board of Advisors and the Property Board in exchange for interest credit. The loans would be paid back in-full

to the donor beginning in December 2017 with the final payoff in December 2021. This will result in a debt free property and allow the Property Board to begin offering scholarships for TKE House occupants in good academic standing and will establish substantial cash reserves for major repairs and improvements. **To date, 11 Delta Nu Fraters** have made the commitment to participate, providing \$105,000 into the mortgage reduction effort. The mortgage currently stands at \$163,000. We have solid commitments for an additional \$35,000 before May 2016 and need only 6 more investors to complete the program. We're getting close to achieving this major goal, putting TKE in the best financial position of any fraternity on the Northwest campus!

**The second effort is the Matching Gift Program.** This is part of the Mortgage Reduction Program and is designed to raise the additional \$10,000 needed to reduce the mortgage to be paid off in May 2017. Your cash contribution will be matched in this program.....if it reaches the pre-determined goal of \$5,000.

To date, we have raised \$1,835 toward our target of \$5,000 by December 31, 2015. If we can raise the full \$5,000 we have a donor that will match that \$5,000 resulting in a total amount of \$10,000. This is a great way to double the importance of your donation to the Capital Improvements Fund and the Mortgage Reduction Program. Please contact me with questions or go online and make that donation today using a credit card!

**The final program is the Level Up Campaign.** We are contacting Fraters who are within a few hundred dollars of the next brick level on the Donor Wall at the TKE house for lifetime Capital Improvements giving, asking them for a contribution. I will begin by reaching out to those donors that are close to the next donor level and asking for their support in the coming months.

Thank you to all the donors for all the generous support you have given to keep Delta Nu strong.



## **Delta-Nu Alumni Association Report** – Brad Shelton, DN#65, Alumni Assn. Membership Chairman

The Delta Nu Alumni Association Membership continues to maintain 175 dues paying members including 5 lifetime memberships!! These men support the Alumni Association that makes this newsletter and provides many of the other services keeping the alumni connected.

Before we present the DNAA's successes to date, we need to define success. Some define success by effectiveness. The question is: "Are the members of the organization making things happen? Are they achieving project goals? Are they contributing in a way that adds value to the organization?" Success means the project becomes better as a result of their participation. They can see the results, and feel fulfilled by their effort, but also know their work fulfills others, either because the service they provide is useful, or because it is helpful.



I urge you to consider what you can do to make things happen and then enjoy the success of your effort as a member of the DNAA.

Over the last 6 months, the DNAA has hosted the 20th annual Delta Nu Memorial Golf Scramble, started the Triangle Award recognition program and have developed the Mortgage Reduction Program mentioned above in the Capital Improvement report. We have begun to build the Active Chapter Mentoring Program and moved the New Member Training program to 7 weeks.....initiating the new men immediately following training. We have helped the chapter establish minimum standards for each chapter member and provided direction on recruitment, ritual, chapter court and encouraged the Scholastic Grade Point Program for the active chapter. We are currently working to develop the web site to a more mobile friendly interface and to develop content more valuable to our younger alumni.



There is no doubt; the Delta-Nu Alumni Association is a successful organization. The key question is what do we do next? We host alumni gatherings in various cities, we participate in golf tournaments and outings and we raise money for Capital Improvements and for scholarships but we have only begun to scratch the surface of what we can achieve collectively!

For the next 365 days, I challenge each of the 175 Delta Nu Alumni Assn. members to reach out to a fellow frater you have not talked with in quite some time to just connect! You will be amazed at where that connection can take you. I challenge those of you who have not become members in the DNAA or were members whose membership lapsed, to consider joining and getting involved. Your membership supports this great cause whether you live in Maryville or you live far away. It is a Magnificent Obsession. The DNAA is looking for good men to carry on this tradition!
