You have heard from us before about all the upgrades we made and how the house is truly the finest facility on the campus at Northwest Missouri State University and one of the finest in the Nation. I invite all of you to come back to Maryville on Friday, June 1st (we have our golf outing during the day and a Frater's party that night!) and Saturday, June 2nd for the house re-dedication ceremony and lunch. This will be a great opportunity to see old friends and see what a phenomenal job Frater Bill Ingels has done on the fraternity house.

I also want to take a moment and thank our active chapter. Last August, the day before they were supposed to move in, the fire struck. Luckily no one was injured. But, 32 men had to find places to live in Maryville before classes started just a few days later. In true Delta Nu fashion everyone found a place to live.

Fraters helped each other and really pulled together. Then, only four months later, we had several of them living in the house while it was still being finished – amazing. As I said earlier, it is now completely finished and what an incredible place! It is something that each and every member of this proud fraternity has dreamed of and is now a reality. None of this could have happened without an active chapter that was willing to step up and do what was necessary to keep the chapter alive.

Further good news is we will have a full house this fall and for each semester going forward. We have a solid business plan and we will be financially solvent. This will allow us to make an even bigger impact in the lives of many young men.

These pictures are of the trophy case and the china cabinet recovered from the 222 West Cooper House and stored by Frater Larry Apple for the last 11 years. Plans are to install these two great artifacts in the new house permanently using one as a trophy case in the entryway and the other as a mail center by the entrance off the patio. We plan to use Capital Improvements Funds for the installation sometime before the 2012-13 school year begins.

Chapter Report – Prytanis Chris Kerwin, 1578 - S508195@mail.nwmissouri.edu



The active chapter worked through the issues resulting from the fire and 21 men moved back into the house for the 2nd semester. The International Fraternity, through the Grand Counsel, establishes Key Result Areas for each chapter. The KRAs are a way to measure our progress toward mutually agreed upon goals in Recruitment, Chapter Size, Community Service, Alumni Relations, Academic Success Philanthropy and Involvement.

Recruitment and Chapter Size We extended 40 bids this year and had 38 accepted. Of these 38, we had 28 men that initiated. This puts the chapter size at 87 men and puts us 2nd in size at NWMSU and in the top 10 in TKE Nation. One thing that helped us with Rush this past year was the TKE Welcome Scholarship. We interviewed seven applicants for the scholarship that were all very well rounded polished candidates. We plan to offer this scholarship funded entirely from Chapter Dues. To improve the retention rate, we have created a brotherhood council to develop functions and events that foster the brotherly bond. We plan a strong recruitment to identify more “blue chip” men and ask them to join. We had 9 seniors that graduated this year with several more to graduate in December.

Community Service and Philanthropy Delta Nu Tekes logged more than 4,236 hours this year in community service at more than 10 different Service Projects. Our efforts included rebuilding buildings, cleaning residence halls, parking lots and streets to improve our campus and the City of Maryville’ aesthetically. We donated time at the local Humane Society to care for the animals and we performed skits at the Greek Night Live event and raised more than \$1,000 and toys for the Children’s Miracle Network. The chapter donated more than \$1,000 for St Jude Hospital with our Rock Off concert and made donations to other charitable causes in excess of \$7,335.



Involvement and Alumni Relations The men of Delta Nu participated in all 10 Intramural sports events winning championships in 4. We had 74% of our members involved in other campus or community organizations with 13 members in leadership positions on campus. We sent 9 men to TKE sponsored leadership conferences and 8 to non-TKE leadership conferences. We held 9 functions with Sororities over the last school year. We supported the Alumni Association at the Homecoming Weekend and had more than 80 active chapter men join with the 75 or so alumni and guests when they came to the house on March 3rd for the DNAA annual meeting. We hosted our annual Mother’s Day Weekend and had more than 30 moms in attendance.

Operations and Academic Success From an operational standpoint we have now moved the weekly meetings back into the house now that we have tables and chairs and the necessary internet and projector items to host these meeting. We have an attendance rate of better than 75% and are working to raise that number even higher. Our biggest challenge is in academics. We maintained a Chapter 2.66 GPA for the year but we know this is not acceptable and the Scholarship Officer has established a new program that requires mandatory study hours and suspended social and chapter participation for members with unacceptable GPAs. We did have several bright spots and Gunner Sumy and Brock Spinner both won academic scholarships from TKE International and Brock was initiated into the Blue Key Society.



If you, or a group of fraters would like to make a contribution to a specific missing year’s representation or composite please send an email or contact me directly.



I want to thank every one of the 175 current and 16 past Delta Nu Alumni Association members for making the DNAA one of the strongest and largest alumni associations in the TKE Nation.

Our roster includes teachers and administrators, business owners, artists, bankers, financial analysts, insurance agents, tradesman, dentists, lobbyists, government employees and even an IRS agent! We came to Maryville from all 50 states and many other countries. We have members living everywhere in all walks and stages of life but we have one thing in common –

We love the Fraternity.

Our membership consists of 14 one year, 33 two year, 126 three year and 1 Lifetime members. These men contribute about \$5,500 annually in the form of dues which is the operating capital for the Alumni Association and the BOA. This operating capital pays for social events for the alumni like the rededication soiree next month or the gathering in Kansas City in July, the maintenance of the web site and the roll out of the new Delta Nu Museum. It also pays for the generation and printing of the Delta Nu Review, the monthly e-Review and the expenses related to communication and support for the good work done by the Philanthropic and Capital Improvements committees.

The Housing Corporation generates the money needed to pay mortgage, insurance, utilities and other property related expenses from rent and parlor fees. No Alumni Assn. dues are used for this.



For the first time since its inception in 2007, the Peter J. Greve Memorial TKE Alumni of Northwest Missouri State University Scholarship is being awarded to two well-deserving high school seniors. Pete, scroll #580, served as Delta Nu Chapter President in 1973-1974. Before succumbing to cancer in March 2009 Pete created the Scholarship now bearing his name. His goal: enable high school seniors to have the same college experience that brought all of us together.

The Scholarship Fund continues approximately halfway to our goal of being self-sustaining. Due to last August's TKE house fire, the annual Fall fundraiser was canceled so that efforts and contributions could be focused where needed most. Now that the house has been rebuilt and is better than ever, I hope you'll remember Pete and his legacy when you plan this year's donations. Last winter's "Super Bowl Squares" fundraiser was a resounding success; so much so, we are making it an annual event. The first one resulted in a very generous surprise...all of the winners returned their winnings to the PJG Scholarship.
