In less than a month, Delta Nu Tekes from the 1950s to the 1990s will meet in Maryville for the groundbreaking for our new home _ the first new fraternity house built in Maryville. This will be a one of a kind event - one you won't want to miss. The events for groundbreaking day and the participation of Delta Nu Tekes will help us to achieve our ultimate goal of a new home for our chapter.

Progress Report — Slowly but Surely

When fire took the house, the Board of Trustees moved swiftly to prepare for the future of Delta Nu Chapter. They assembled a group of alumni to spearhead the drive to acquire funds for the new TKE House. We all met six months ago and have worked non-stop since. The goal of our committee was to raise \$200,000 by November and provide the necessary commitment to proceed with this project. We have been very busy working toward this goal, but we still need your help.

Currently we have approximately 70 fraters who have pledged to the cause. Those Fraters have committed nearly \$25,000 through pledges over the next 3 years. Many thanks to these fraters and the commitments they have made to help Delta Nu.



Progress Report - Continued


