




#### **ALUMNI NEWS**

Frater John Luff "626" is employed by Mountain Bell and is an analyst in the Database Administration Group.










Homecoming Awards: the NWMSU Spirit Flag, first place trophies for our float, housedeck and group clowns, and a third place for our Homecoming skit.


Fraters Tad Trecker and Jim Booth prepare to lead the TKE skit,  $Young\ Frankenstein$ .
