#### Fellow Fraters of Delta Nu:

Our first official year of fundraising will come to an end at the June 27<sup>th</sup>, TKE Mike Settle Softball Tournament. Thus far we can say that our efforts are paying off. The goal of \$200,000 was set and we are pleased with the response. Over 270 Fraters have pledged over \$120,000. That leaves us with only \$80,000 left to be pledged and collected by the year 2000. I speak for the committee when I say thank you very much for your overwhelming generosity.

Of the \$120,000 that has been pledged just under \$50,000 has been received. With one year down and two more years to go we want to remind you that it's not too late to get your commitment to this project, your new TKE house. Envelopes are provided for you to send in your pledge or a payment towards your pledge and statements will be sent out twice a year to remind you of your obligation that you have made towards the future of TKE at NWMSU.

I know a lot of you are planning to give to the house fund. Speaking as a co-chairman, you will make our jobs considerably easier if you make your commitment known to us as soon as possible. Many of us who have volunteered our time would appreciate your response to our request through these mailers.

Once again, a huge thank you to those who have given already and for those who have not pledged yet we look forward to hearing from you.




**Delta Nu Contributor**-\$50-\$249 Will also be recognized for their gift.

Average amount pledged by Fraters is \$420. Percentage of Fraters out of 1300 members so far is 21%.



- RIGHT and follow gravel road back to the fields


