


Delta Nu Philanthropy Efforts

Delta Nu Celebrates 50 Years

On Saturday, May 15, fifty years ago to the day, Delta Nu Fraters from all generations gathered at the TKE House to celebrate TKE's founding at Northwest Missouri State. Since then, Delta Nu Chapter of Tau Kappa Epsilon has had a solid history as a leading fraternity at Northwest and a leading chapter within the TKE International organization. Since 1954, more than 1400 Fraters have signed the scroll making Delta Nu one of the fastest growing chapters of all time in Tau Kappa Epsilon.

The 50th Anniversary Celebration weekend began Friday, May 14th with the Annual TKE Alumni Golf Tournament headed by Tournament Chairman, Michael Reiff, at Mozingo Lake. The tournament, which started ten years ago is held annually each May. The 2004 tournament was sold out with 73 golfers, making it the largest attendance in tournament history allowing for a shotgun start. Moss. During the evening, everyone took advantage of the opportunity to bond with one another, experience the brotherhood we all share and catch up with other Fraters on a beautiful evening.

On Saturday, the anniversary weekend hit its full stride with numerous events for all in attendance. The morning began with a kickoff and welcome, by 50th Anniversary Chairman, Frater Steve Moss. The kickoff provided a chance to get the day started as well as recognize many of the distinguished



guests, including Frater Dick Wiles, who served Delta Nu as Board of Control Chairman from the mid-1960s to the mid 1980s. Northwest Alumni Association Mike Johnson updated everyone on the University's progress and the upcoming Centennial for Northwest. Frater Mark Fite, TKE International Grand Epi-Prytanis, gave an inspiring talk as he and Frater Brian Ferber, TKE International VP of Operations, represented the International Fraternity for the weekend. We also took a moment to remember our fallen Fraters who have entered TKE's Chapter eternal. The weekend was dedicated to Frater Kurt Gentry, 1280, who lost his battle with cancer earlier in 2004.

Lunch was served on the patio, and some Fraters took the opportunity to visit the newly renovated football stadium where a group of

TKE alumni have a luxury suite.

Active and Alumni Fraters gathered back at the TKE house for an afternoon TKE Ritual ceremony and initiation meeting as all Delta Nu alumni in attendance were initiated in to the "Teke for Life" ritual. This new ritual ceremony was adopted several years ago, intended for those Fraters who are graduating seniors and are joining the ranks as a Teke alumnus. Frater Richard Dinkel, Delta Nu Scroll #13 was the earliest Past Prytanis in Attendance. He served as the opening

Prytanis for the day and then passed the leadership to current Active Prytanis, Frater Jason Merhoff. Undergraduate Frater, Derek Smith Scroll #1433 was also written into the Delta Nu history books as he was initiated into the bond of TKE and signed the scroll in front of a standing-room-only crowd on this momentous day for Delta Nu. The meeting continued with a business meeting and update on alumni activities and progress since opening the TKE house in 1999. The meeting was closed with a traditional TKE Gavel Pass. The TKE gavel was passed through the hands of those fraters who have made TKE successful in its early years as well as those

hands who are leading our chapter today.

Frater Dinkel highlighted the meeting as he commended the current chapter members for their efforts for TKE's philanthropy, The Alzheimer's Association. Frater Dinkel generously agreed to match the chapter's recent fundraising effort of \$800 with \$1,000 if those in attendance would agree to could provide the additional \$200 needed to reach \$1,000 that day. His call to the alumni in attendance was answered and effort ended with the needed \$1,000 being raised and an additional \$1,000 from Frater Dinkel bringing the entire contribution to The Alzheimer's Association to \$2,000! Alzheimer's disease recently touched Frater Dinkel's family and is an especially important cause to him.

Dear Delta Nu Frater.

As a first on the Northwest Missouri State University campus, TKE and its Alumni embarked on building the first "Fraternity Specific" house after fire destroyed our Home of 38 years at 222 West Cooper Street. During 1997 the recovery and rebuilding plan was implemented and called for construction of a new Delta Nu house to be built near the campus. This plan costing \$650,000 consisted of \$200,000 financing from Alumni and \$450,000 from our Active Chapter members. The alumni fundraising drive netted \$130,000 to support this project, well short of the original goal. Six years after the fact, \$32,000 remains uncollected from the alumni portion of the financing plan and the goal is still has not been met.

Up until now, the TKE Board of Trustees has tried to make things work, but the shortcomings on the fundraising for the TKE Alumni portion of the plan have now put us in an un-favorable position with our creditors. We are now working to ensure that our TKE House remains as a testament to all the active Tekes and TKE Alumni at Northwest.

We need your help to remedy this situation. Currently, we are reorganizing and mobilizing our efforts and fundraising drive. Our goal is to assure Bank Midwest that a "Good Faith payment" of \$20,000 was delivered on **December 1, 2004**. An additional payment of \$20,000 will be delivered by April 1, 2005 to remove our financial hardship and the banks concern for their loan to us. Plans are in place for the Active Chapter to resume their financial obligation for the balance of the note.

Since our 50th Anniversary celebration in May 2004, we have taken this cause to heart and along with The TKE International Headquarters, we are working on putting Delta Nu back in the game and on track for another TOP TKE Chapter Award. All of us working with the Active Chapter are taking a serious look ahead into TKE's future at Northwest. Already our Actives are on course with pledging 34 new associates. Additionally, the following elements will be key to our success:

- 1 A "PayPal" donation collection service is being implemented to allow Tekes to contribute via the TKE website
- We have established strong and ongoing communication with Actives, Alumni and the Offices of the Grand Chapter.

It's up to **YOU** and every Frater on the Delta Nu scroll. Help us contact others...and pass it on! **Take action today!** Let us remember those who came before us, those who are with us today and those who will become part of our chapter's future. Let us remember that what we do today will only foster and continue our TEKE for Life oath.
