

NATIONAL OKAYS LOAN For NEW CHAPTERHOUSE

At last the long-hoped-for dream of the men at Delta Nu for a new chapterhouse will become a reality!

Mational has approved Delta Mu's application for \$215,000 to build a 60-man chapterhouse near the campus. Of the \$215,000, \$15,000 will come from National on a Home Improvement loan, and the remaining \$200,000 will come through a loan co-signed by Mational and Delta Mu.

Several actives, as well as pledges, have spent many hours ironing out red tape for this project. If everything goes as planned, the ground should be broken when you visit us at the MCD. Planned completion is expected to be for the Fall of 1967...

Although blueprints haven't been completed as yet, the house will be a modern two story structure, with an enclosed courtyard.

COLOR TV TO BE GIVEN AWAY AT "RCB"

In order to lower the existions mortgage on the present chapterhouse, Delta Mu has undertaken a gigantic fund drive with a color TV providing incentive for donating.

Receipts will be given for each 25 cents donated, and a drawing will be held during the Red Carnation Ball for a \$500 RCA color TV set. This beautiful set with walnut cabinetry is on display at Stickley RCA in Maryville.

Sales are booming at present with over 3000 tickets already sold. Pledges are leading the way with several of them selling over 300 tidiets.

To reach our goal of 20,000 tickets we would like the assistance of the alums. Although a Delta Nu active cannot win the color Ty, alwas are sligible to make donations and to win the TV. Not only can you help us in this manner, but you can give your friends or next door neighbor a chance to win the TV.

Dear Boys,


Serving as house mother for the best fraternity on campus has been a gratifying experience for the past eight years!
