



The New TKE House has been built and IS A KEALITY! It looks great and is worth every precious penny spent by our Board of Trustees. We are extremely fortunate to have the Fraters on this alumni board, working hard for TKE and the future of Delta Nu Chapter. (Many of the other fraternities on campus only dream of having such an involved Alumni Board of Trustees.) With that said, TKE and the Board are still working hard to gain your support in helping retire the debt on the house.

Thus far, we are very pleased with what we have accomplished as alumni. Below are some of the statistics on the TKE House building project, which I want to share with you. There are some real positive messages to be taken away from this as well as some messages that are a real wake up call for some fraters. As we continue to assure the success of this project, <u>YOU</u> as TKE alumni need to fully understand where we are with the fundraising project and where we are on collecting on some of those pledges.

The task of raising money is a challenging one, but the task of reminding and reminding again those who have supported this cause to send in their contributions is not a fun one. Please review the numbers below and help make our job a little simpler by making a pledge to this cause or making a payment on your previously made pledge.

Total number of Fraters initiated into Delta Nu since 1954	1350
Total number of Fraters that have made a pledge to the New House Fund	383
Total number of Fraters that <u>have</u> paid off their pledge in full	233
Total number of Fraters with NO payment toward their pledge	74
Average Pledge amount per man	\$430
Total cash Pledged	\$155,500
Total cash received	\$108,400
Fundraising Committee Goal by year end 2000 \$	200,000

It should be noted that not all goods and services that have been pledged as donations are represented in the numbers above because we have not received written documentation on some of the gifts made by various Fraters. (Estimated at nearly \$15,000)

30 percent of the fraters on the Delta Nu scroll <u>have</u> pledged the capital to help pay for the alumni portion of the house. There is still a strong need for more contributors to reach our goal and make it work.

(A rough look at the financing of this project has the **Delta Nu alumni providing finances for 1/3 of the debt**. **The remaining 2/3 of the debt will be paid off through the collection of rent from the undergraduate chapter** and the mortgage over the next 30 years)

We realize that not every member on our alumni list is going to help. It is our hope to get 500 total Fraters on the donation list by the end of the year and therefore easily reaching our goal of \$200,000.

We also want to encourage those of you that have paid your pledge off with considerable ease to reconsider giving an annual contribution of \$50 or \$100 or what ever is feasible for you. If this is possible you can upgrade your previous pledge. All donations will accumulate and be accounted for, as your name on the "Richard W. Wiles Teke for Life Alumni Donor Wall" will be upgraded as different donation levels are achieved.

Let's face it, our scroll has 1350 names on it, so this is the list of fraters that we are turning to for support. Please consider helping our cause and keeping TKE a strong fraternity at Northwest. We are there as "THE FRATERNITY" with the new house and now are assuring proper management of the debt that comes along with this great asset! We look forward to hearing from you.

#### Tokos Support Special Olympics And Bearcat Football

On October 9, 1999, Delta Nu started what hopes to be an annual event. Every year before the Northwest vs. Missouri Western football game, the official game ball will be run by the away school's TKE chapter to the home stadium of the opposing school. This year Delta Nu ran the ball to the Missouri Western Tekes at Spratt Stadium in St. Joseph. Fraters took turns running one-mile intervals to accomplish the goal. The grand total of about \$1,000 was raised for Special Olympics this year, and with more and more publicity in the following years, the total donations should continue to increase.

# Summer Rush & the TKE Scholarship Fund

This summer the TKE's are planning their first ever summer rush program. The summer rush program will also be combined with a new \$250 scholarship awarded to a deserving incoming freshman. The goal is to get a head start in getting our name out.

The program will begin by sending out an application to all incoming freshmen. Included in the application will be a color brochure on TKE. When applications are returned, the actives will decide who the qualifiers are for the \$250 scholarship. The decision will be based on g.p.a., high school involvement, community involvement, and extracurricular activities.

"In the past few fall rushes, we have slacked off. We have just not been aggressive enough," said frater Mark Partise. But now, with this new program, we are hoping to attract at least 25-30 quality men to join the ranks of TKE.
