

Dear Fraters,


I would first like to thank the numerous alumni for helping to make a very

Dear Fraters,

The Fall 1994 semester has been a rather pressing semester financially for Delta-Nu Chapter. Due to a high number of fraters graduating last Spring, Delta-Nu only had forty-five members, seven of which decided to go inactive. This is the reason why Delta-Nu was not able to afford a float and house-dec this home-coming. But as a result of our success in the skit, a great deal of interest has been spurred among the fraters to increase our rushing efforts. I estimate that by next Fall, this chapter will be able to afford a float and house-dec both!

The only policy changes that I have to report is the change in the inactive status at Delta-Nu. Several years ago, an inactive status policy was adopted at Delta-Nu. It stated that any frater could go inactive at any time for any reason so long as they paid their national insurance and dues. This would keep them initiated members according to Nationals, but they would not have full active status at Delta-Nu. Perhaps this was not the way it was intended to be in the beginning, duty that is what it turned into. The problems that arose from this is that fraters would go inactive, the fraternity would then pay their insurance and dues, but the inactives would then default on payment of inactive dues. Over the prolonged period since this policy was started, Delta-Nu has steadily lost money each year. Due to our financial difficulties this semester, the Executive Board decided to disregard the inactive status as we should have been doing all along. The old Delta-Nu inactive status policy is now history. It is now replaced by the official National Inactive Policy which

states that members may only go inactive for specific reasons and that they must petition to the chapter, then to the Board of Advisors, then to Nationals. If their petition passes all these boards, they will be granted inactive status for one semester. If they wish to remain inactive they must petition again. To be reactivated they must petition to the Active Chapter. This policy may seem strict, but Delta Nu is facing hard times right now and frankly, we can not afford to pay for inactives anymore.

The Tau Kappa Epsilon Alumni Association held their 6th Annual *Mike Settle Memorial Softball Tournament*, June 25th in Kearney, MO. The tournament, held in honor of the late TKE alumnus Mike Settle, attracted more than 60 TKE alumni from Northwest as well as numerous spouses and family members. Also on hand were 20 members of the undergraduate chapter who were in attendance to defend the 1993 tournament title.

Not only were there alumni attending from the Kansas City, Omaha and Des Moines areas but many traveled significantly further including the cities of Detroit, Chicago and Dallas.

While at the tournament, alumni were informed of the latest activities happening at Northwest. Additionally an update on the Greek system was given and plans for the upcoming TKE 40th Anniversary celebration to be held in conjunction with this fall's homecoming festivities scheduled for October 15 were discussed.

One highlight of the tournament included formal dedication of the *Jeff McNeely Most Valuable Player Award*. McNeely who was the MVP of the first tournament in 1989, passed away in February, 1994. Because the championship game had to be called after four innings due to severe weather, both teams voted unanimously to dedicate this year's award to Jeff's son Ryne McNeely.

Jeff's immediate family was on hand earlier during the day's festivities to accept a trust fund which was established for Ryne and organized by TKE alumni members Tom Ibarra and Jim Smith.

A portion of the tournament proceeds will be added to the TKE Scholarship Fund which has been established with *Northwest Foundation Inc.* The TKE Alumni Association would like to encourage those Delta Nu alumni who are supporting *the Northwest Foundation* to consider supporting the TKE Scholarship Fund when making contributions to Northwest during the phone-a-thon or other fund raising efforts during the year. 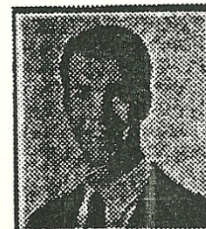
