Honoring the Memory of a Frater



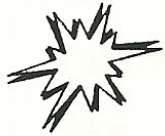

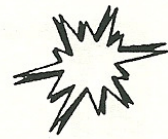
