

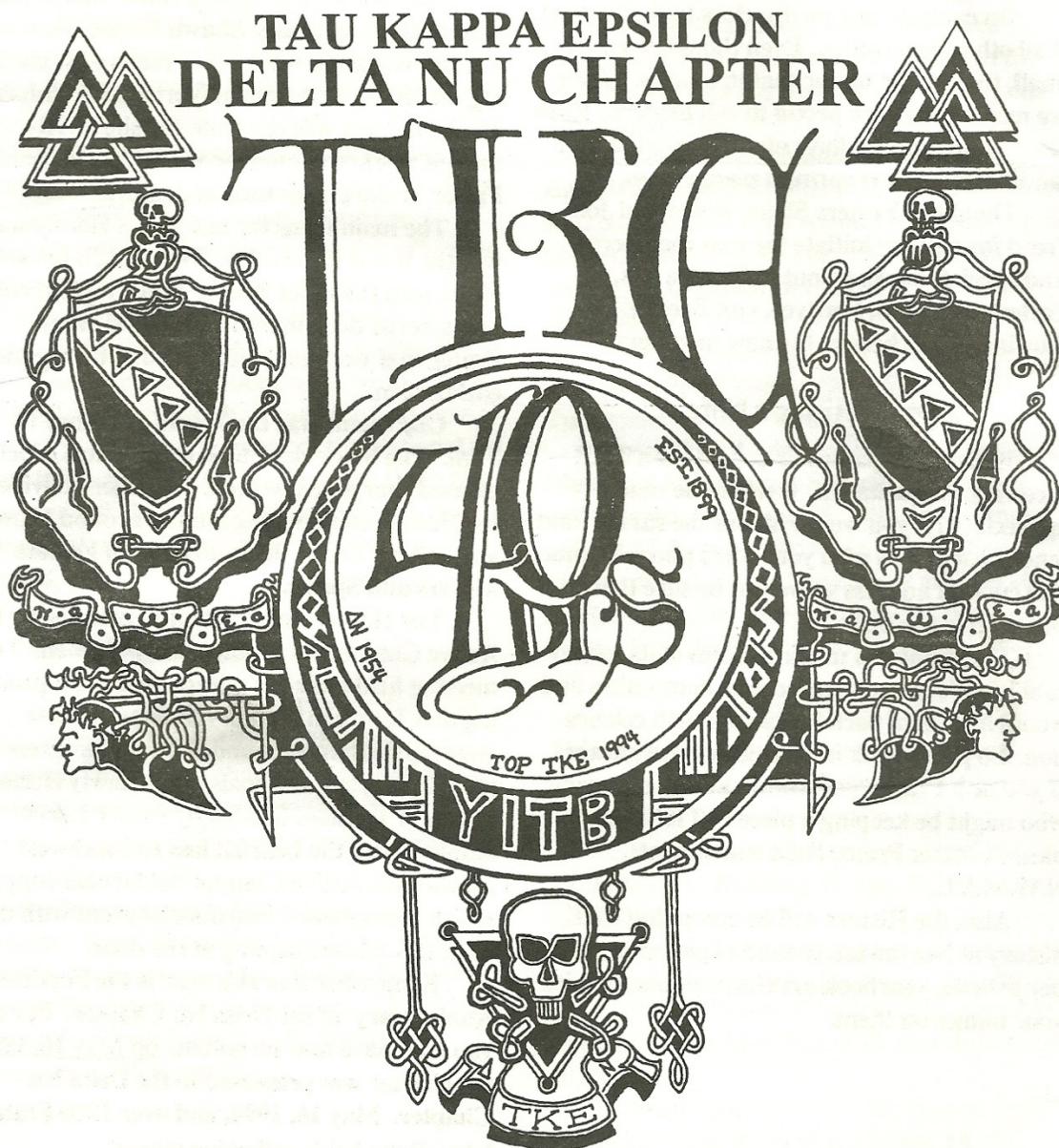

Our theme was the World of Disney on Film. The house deck took third place, which pleased everyone involved. All other activities for Homecoming were centered around Clowns and Jalopy, under the leadership of Fraters Meyers and Speihs.

The Homecoming activities planned by the Active Chapter for alumni also went well. The meeting held after the parade marked a promising new future in alumni relations. Frater Russell Northup expounded on the progress of the chapter, and the goals of the newly elected Board of Trustees headed by Frater Larry Apple. After the Bearcat loss to Southwest Baptist, the Active Chapter held a chili supper which transgressed into a social event with more than 150 Alumni signing at the door.

Remember that this year is the Fortieth Anniversary of the Delta Nu Chapter. For all you who have now forgotten, on May 16, 1954, the charter was presented to the Delta Nu Chapter. May 16, 1994, and over 1200 Fraters later, Delta Nu is still going strong.

## Membership Has It's Advantages

Earlier this semester, Frater Dustin Bieghler accepted the Top TKE Chapter Award in San Francisco. The Delta Nu Chapter entered the ranks of the elite TKE Chapters. This year marks the fifth time in our history we have received this coveted award.

Being a Top TKE Chapter has its advantages. During fall rush, Nationals sent Delta Nu a rush coach to motivate the chapter. Last fall we inducted 19 pledges. On November 1, 1993, Frater William Slade was sent to evaluate as well as motivate the chapter. After his inspection of the chapter, he gave us a superior rating. He visited with each officer as well as several members of the Board of Trustees. Frater Slade offered several suggestions, and enlightened the chapter with valuable information about what we needed to do during rush. That had been the first time in several years that a member of the National Staff had addressed the needs of the Delta Nu Chapter. With Frater Slade's guidance, we hope to repeat with winning another Top TKE Award.

## Red Carnation Ball

Last winter's Red Carnation Ball was held on November 6, 1993, at the Omaha Marriott Hotel. The chapter had voted last spring to move our formal to the fall due to spring break interfering with undergraduate's financial status. This year marked the largest attendance in several years by the active chapter. Over 30 couples were in attendance. Fraters Doug Bushner and Rodger Ites were among the Alumni in Attendance. The chapter agreed to schedule the R.C.B. during all proceeding fall semesters.

## Honoring Our Fraters

The rain may have washed away most of the Midwest this year, but it did not diminish the love for a Frater. The Annual Memorial Mike Settles Softball Tournament had been rained out several times this year. Frater Tom Ibarra set the final tournament schedule to take place in Kearney, MO. 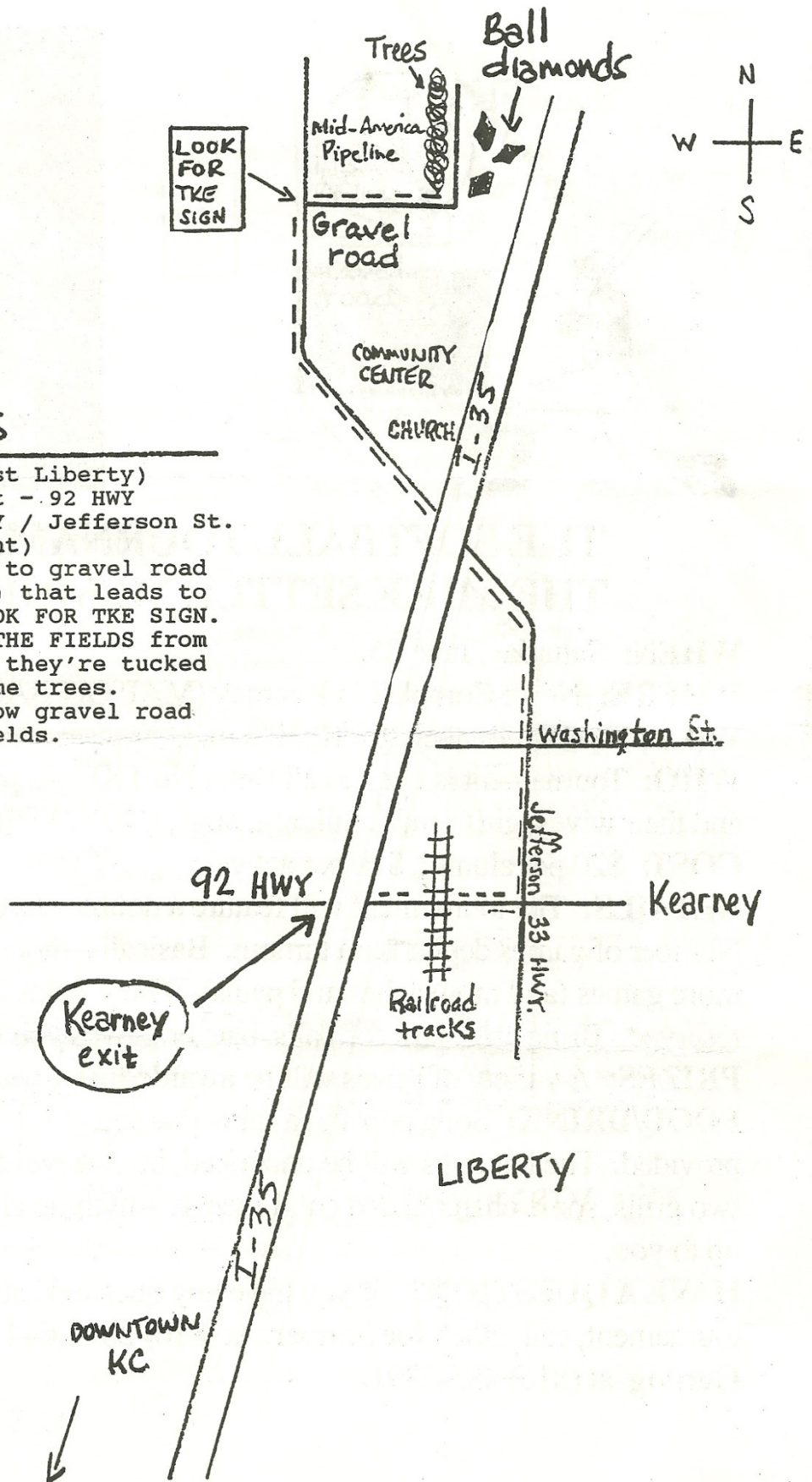

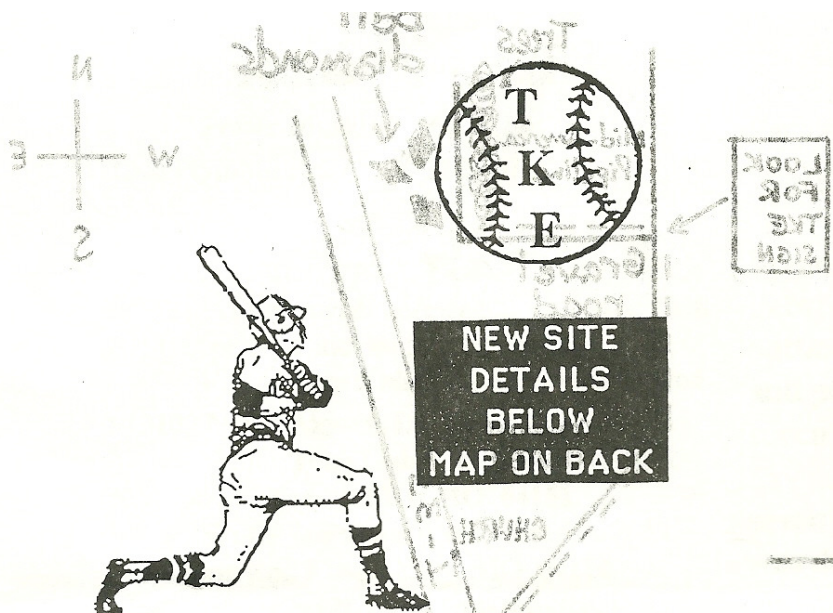

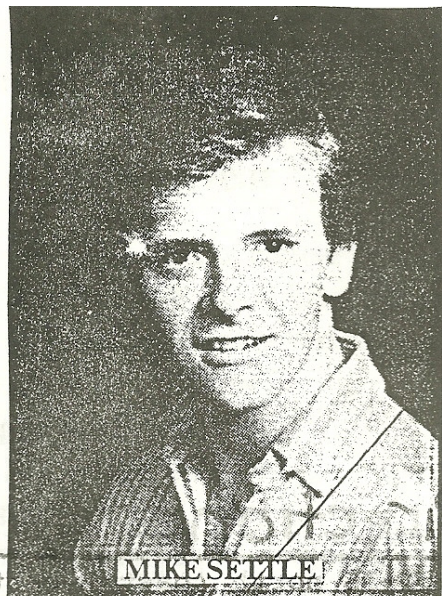
## Directions
