
Dear Alumni:



Motivationl Seminar

On January 25, Delta-Nu Chapter and Northwest Missouri State University were graced with the presence of Frater T.J. Schmitz. Frater Schmitz, who was initiated at Iota-Omicron chapter at the University of Wisconsin-Whiteside and who formerly served as the Executive Vice-President for TKE international's, delivered a motivational seminar at Northwest's Mary Linn Performing Arts Center. The event, sponsored by the Northwest Interfraternity Council (IFC), was geared toward motivating members of campus greek organizations so that they might be able to contribute to the improvement of their chapter standards. Among the topics Frater Schmitz discussed were obstacles that fraternity and sorority organizations commonly face (members not paying dues, dead weight members), and methods of overcoming these problems.

Goalsetting and and implementing goals as well as how to get chapter members involved in chapter activities were also topics T.J. discused. Among the greek organizations in appearance were the five campus sororities, including Sigma Sigma Sigma and Delta Zeta, and campus fraternities which included Delta Sigma Phi, Sigma Phi Epsilon, and of course, Tau Kappa Epsilon.

Frater Schmitz also met with the Executive Board to discuss our chapter status and goals.

The Goal of college is to earn a degree while maintaining a good academic standing. This is also a goal of TKE, where academic success is stressed so this may be achieved.

Greetings from the Chapter Alumni Advisor. Just back from a Regional Leadership Conference in Chicago. TKE, under the leadership of our new Executive Director, Bill Metzger, has launched the 96th year of TKE with a new initiative designated the Apollo Project. Publicity related to incidents of hazing, alcohol, sexual abuse, drugs, loud parties, charges of minors-in-possession, etc. has caused the greek system to suffer worldwide. Frater Metzger is convinced that each one of us see TKE as something more than the "image" of greek that the last few years has painted for the public observers of the college fraternity system. The Apollo Project is an attempt to refocus the undergraduate chapters and let the system really answer the question, "What do we have to offer?" The objectives of Tau Kappa Epsilon say things like "To cherish and and maintain the high ideals in which Tau Kappa Epsilon was founded: Love, Charity, Esteem."

The national average annual rush for the top five college fraternities for the last academic year was 22. TKE averaged 12. Is our message so much different from the others? This effort is not only directed at bringing in new men, but retaining our current members as active productive fraters in the "Teke for Life" tradition.
