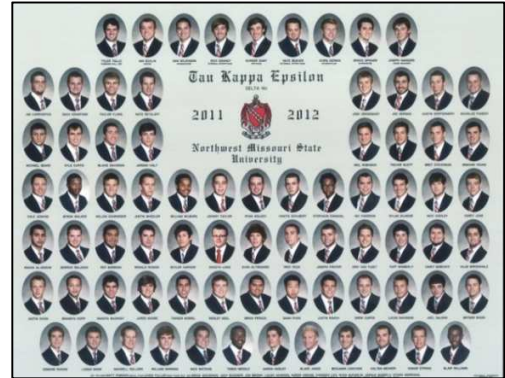

**Active Chapter Report – Prytanis - Max Sollars, 1592**  
**– Grammateus - Tobias Weddle, 1597**

**Recruitment and Chapter Size:** This spring we had one of the largest spring rush classes in recent memory. We signed 6 of the 7 bids given out. Pledge training has begun and our Hegemon, Taylor Flora, 1537, is teaching the new members what it means to be a TKE. With the addition of these new members, we have an active chapter size of 81 men. Delta Nu is now the second largest fraternity on campus. We have 9 men graduating in May and 4 others graduated at the Winter break. With so many graduates, Delta Nu will focus on fall 2013 recruitment like never before! Replacing these Actives will be a challenge, so if you know of any individuals attending NWSU be sure to pass along the contact information to Max Sollars, Chapter President

If we continue to implement our rush strategy of “Each Man Get a Man”, we will be able to attract quality candidates. Each active chapter member has agreed to recruit one man to make Delta-Nu one of the top TKE chapters in the nation.



**Philanthropic Events:** TKE has been extremely active on campus in the area of Philanthropy. We have made it a priority for our members to get involved with as many philanthropic events as possible. The men of Delta Nu have accumulated over 1,000 man hours and have been involved in several community service events. We participated in the St. Jude's letter writing convention. This fund raising event involved 60 chapter members each writing 25 letters requesting charitable donations. We ranked 2nd for the most people involved out of all the other organizations. We also had more than 10 Fraters run in the “Phi Mu Annual 5K”, and those non-runners

turned out to support the event hosted by the women of Phi Mu. We 2 Fraters, Brock Spinner and Tobias Weddle, compete in the Golden Plunge. This plunge is a way of raising money for Special Olympics. Although neither of them ended up being finalist, they still were nominated by Northwest and raised over \$260 for Special Olympics. At homecoming, one of the events was canned art. We donated hundreds of cans of food for this event and were recognized on campus as a major contributor. We sponsored a Trick-Or-Treat for canned food at the end of October and collected even more cans to donate. Three Fraters were nominated to participate in Mr. Northwest, a philanthropic event put on by Alpha Sigma Alpha where we donated money for each nominee. The entire chapter turned out to participate. We have been involved in many tournaments hosted by other fraternities for philanthropic purposes and are signed up to participate in a Kickball tournament to raise money for St. Junes. We took 2nd place in the St. Junes 3 on 3 basketball tournament and during the past semester, the men of Delta Nu have donated more than \$1,200 to charity. Our man-hours and donations for philanthropy will increase after we host our “Camping for Cans” event in the middle of April, our annual Concert open to the public and the “Mustache March” event.



**Involvement and Alumni Relations:** Delta Nu has made great progress in interactions with Delta Nu Alumni. This spring, 8 active members attended the TKE Regional Leadership conference in Kansas City. These men came back with fresh ideas and a new understanding of leadership. The men of Delta Nu dominated campus intramurals this year with 1<sup>st</sup>



place in 5 on 5 Basketball and Ping Pong as well as winning 2nd place in Football, Walleyball and 3 on 3 Basketball. By participating and placing in about 80% of the events offered, we were able to win the Title this year!

Our school Spirit and support of Northwest athletics is also off the charts! The chapter won a cash prize for our turnout and enthusiastic support of our Northwest Basketball team. We received recognition by the local newspaper, local news channel, Northwest Homepage and our success was HUGE over social media with players and coaches thanking us for our support. In the future, Delta Nu plans to have a tent

setup to tailgate during all 2013 home football games, so please plan to join the active chapter not just for homecoming and Arrowhead games, but for all home games.

Three of our members are officers on Student Senate. In addition, Frater Maxwell Sollars is the treasurer for the IFC, Frater Tobias Weddle was recently initiated into Blue Key and Frater Brock Spinner is currently the President of Blue Key. The new Executive Board set the goal to be the most involved and well-rounded organization on campus and we are well on our way to being the most involved and supportive men on the Northwest Missouri State University campus.

**Mortgage Report**

Loan Balance as of 3/20/2013 is **\$329,680**. Interest Rate of 4.10% starting May 1, 2012 expiring on May 1, 2017 Minimum monthly payment of \$2,620 per month based on 180 months payment to retire loan on April 31, 2027 Currently we pay \$3,200 a month and will have a loan balance on May 1, 2017 of \$220,000. If the rate remained at 4.10% in 2017 and we make payments of \$3,200 monthly, we would pay off the mortgage in 2022. The property is insured for **\$1,449,038** and our annual premium is **\$4,825**. We got several other quotes that were all much higher.

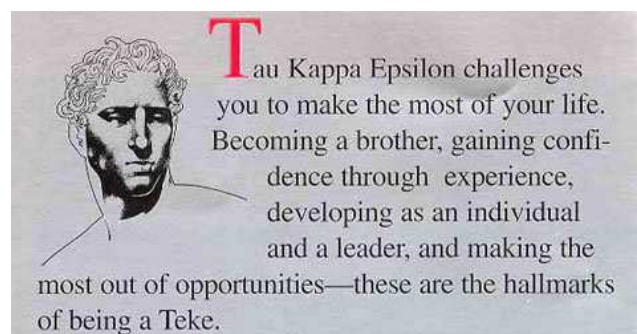

**Monthly Get Togethers**

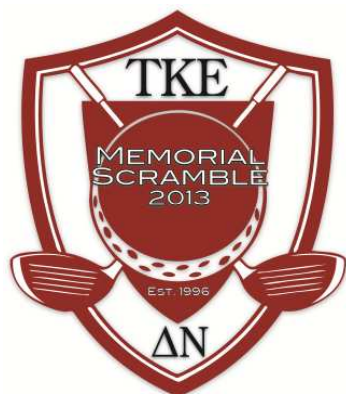

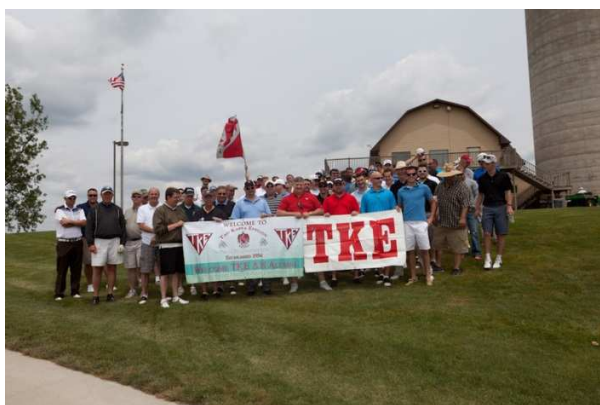

## Alumni Profile – Richard “Dink” Dinkel, Scroll 13



Frater Richard Dinkel hails from Greenfield, Iowa and graduated high school there in 1953. He then attended NWMSC, graduating 1958 with a BS in Secondary Education, Business/ Economics/ Sociology. pictured to the right.

After graduation, Frater Dinkel was drafted into the US Army in 1958, serving two years. He points out that early in the history of the chapter a number of Delta Nu TKEs had served in the military, and the non-hazing policy of TKE served as an attraction as ‘they weren’t about to come back from that and subject themselves to (hazing) by a bunch of high school kids’. Much of the early success of the chapter was due to the maturity and leadership of these Fraters.

During his years at NWMSC, he was part of the gang that frequently met at Paul and Karla White’s house to eat dinner and develop vision for TKE Delta Nu. The active chapter was then housed at Quad #4 on campus pictured left.

In 1958, he married his wife Mickey, from Council Bluffs, Iowa. Sadly, in 1989 Mickey was diagnosed with Early Onset Alzheimer's Disease, which would ultimately claim her life in 2001. Richard served as her fulltime caregiver during this time. This experience and TKEs national commitment to Alzheimer's Research and philanthropy is important to Frater Dinkel, who encourages all TKEs to support this important charity.

After attending NWMSC and his years of military service, Richard worked in the Group Claims department for Bankers Life of Des Moines, Iowa - later renamed Principal Financial. He relocated to Atlanta in 1966, serving as their Southeast Regional Claims Supervisor. In 1971, he began consulting in the area of Employee Benefits, then as a Financial Services Marketing Representative from '84 – '87. A few years of construction related self-employment and eleven years ('92-'03) as a Customer Service Manager for Mitchell Marketing, Inc round out Frater Dinkel’s many years of productive work history in the Health, Financial, and Marketing sectors.

Richard retired in 2004, but he hasn’t slowed down too much. He took up golf at the young age of 69, and is still walking the course today, weather permitting.

TKE provided Richard a core group of ‘Friends for Life’ and people who inspire and challenge him to this day. He has remained in contact with those core friends throughout his working years. He is a Life Loyal Teke and continues to be a significant donor and supporter of Delta Nu chapter. He is an active dues paying member of the Delta Nu Alumni Assn. for the last 6 years. It is this author’s opinion that Frater Dinkel has fully represented all that is TKE – love, charity, and esteem - in his life and actions since his college days.
