


Re-building the Tradition That Is Delta Nu

Laying the foundation for a new beginning

In 1958, one of Northwest Missouri State College's four fraternities moved out of the campus' quads and into a two-story colonial-style house at 222 W. Cooper Street in Maryville and began to build a tradition that was founded in mid-May of 1954. Thirty-eight years, four Top TKE Chapter awards and over 1300 members later, fire all but completely destroyed what many considered "home" and ended one memorable era. November 16, 1996, will go down in Maryville history as the day Delta Nu chapter began its renewal. Friends and pledge brothers will renew old bonds worn thin by separation, and strangers will meet and work together, motivated by a common love for TKE. Over its 43-year history, the Delta Nu chapter of Tau Kappa Epsilon became the youngest chapter (109th) with the most men initiated into membership (1303). A new era is in view for Delta Nu at Northwest Missouri State University as plans are already in place to build the first new fraternity house in Maryville. If you would like to know more about the history and future of this great chapter, read on.

An Ongoing History

On November 16, 1996, a fire that began in a room on the south side of third floor spreads and destroys that floor and renders the entire structure a complete loss, forcing the evacuation of residing members. The fire was declared an accident by the fire marshall and insurance company, but business continued with Board of Trustees President Larry Apple loaning use of meeting space behind his business at 108 W. 5th Street. The structure was raised on January 18, 1997. Losses included the personal belongings of four members, some files and the computer just donated to the chapter that held the alumni files (currently being re-updated by the fundraising committee). Luckily, no one was injured and the scroll, all ritual equipment, original woodwork and 17 composites were recovered. As much as possible will be incorporated into the new house.

With \$66,000 coming from the insurance company for house and contents, the Delta Nu Board of Directors moved to purchase a 3.2 acre lot, adjacent to campus at 9th and Walnut for \$60,000. The new house will be a 8,000 sq. ft., colonial-style house with a brick face, kitchen and meeting room, and house approximately 32 men. The lot at 222 W. Cooper (2.34 acres) was sold for \$32,500 and an EPA test ordered on the new property. The test passed and the Board of Directors began to assemble a fundraising committee comprised of alumni from scroll 125 to 1248. This committee has volunteered to coordinate planning, marketing and raising funds for this new house. The goal in sight is three-fold: 1) \$200,000 (and more), 2) groundbreaking this Fall and 3) open house in 1998.

Over the next three months, members of the fundraising committee and other volunteers will be contacting you to ask once again for you to commit time, money, services and materials that will help rebuild the tradition that is Delta Nu chapter of Tau Kappa Epsilon.

Timeline

On Saturday, June 21, the New House Fundraising Campaign began at the 9th Annual TKE Mike Settle Softball Tournament in Kearney, MO which served as a kickoff event. The campaign is scheduled to go on for three months and be culminated by a groundbreaking ceremony in the Fall which will include groundbreaking, a recognition of the campaign and committee, as well as other events honoring all alumni. There will also be a special ritual planned called "The Fraternity for Life". Presented by an officer of TKE International, this ritual culminates the entire fraternity experience and enlightens inductees to the "final secret" of TKE. Over the course of the campaign, fraters will be contacted and asked to participate in regional parties and other events. The hope is to begin construction before the end of the year and open the house by the Fall of 1998.

The Wall

Imagine: A pledge class assembles in front of a brick wall surrounding a fireplace in a fraternity house chapter room. Encouraged to memorize the name and scroll number of an alumni whose by name is etched forever on a brick in that wall, the pledges are told the story of how that wall is stronger because of each brick that has been added. Each new pledge to the fraternity is told that his name and scroll can one day join other fraters in the bond by adding their own brick to the wall. Through your commitment to the third level of achievement, your name and scroll number will be among the first to build "The Wall."

We can all help rebuild the TKE house that we all only dreamed about years ago, but it'll take more than a dream. It will take you. How? Raising money. It isn't easy to ask for money or to give it away, but we're hoping that after you've recalled your years in TKE and what it meant to you that you will help.

"With few exceptions, we are all winners!!! If we decide why we win we will find a parent, teacher, coach, wife, or friend who helped us get there. We collectively won because of what we found on that lonely country road the night of our pledge walk. It's called Fraternal inspiration: A Brotherhood. As a united group of alumni you have the opportunity through your donations to build a fraternity house and become an answer on a pledge test. You now have a chance to rekindle that inspiring tradition."

How you can help

Delta Nu Order of the Three Fires - \$500 to \$999 - Remembering what we learned, and passing it on.

A. All privileges of Level 1.

B. Your name and scroll number to be permanently etched into your personal brick in "The Wall" in the chapter room of the new house.

Delta Nu Frater - \$1000 and over - To be built again - stronger than ever.

A. All privileges of Level 1.

B. Your name and scroll number permanently etched into a natural limestone block immediately surrounding and adjacent to the fireplace.

These levels have been created to ease your choice in contributing to your new fraternity house, and they are not all-inclusive. Send whatever you feel you can give, it will be recognized. These levels can be achieved by sending one check now or by your pledge that will allow you to pay over a longer period of time. Please see the enclosed pledge card for details.
