### **Alumni Association Treasurer's Report**

#### **Treasurer's Report**

DNAA transferred \$35,000 from the Alumni Checking account to an interest-bearing account along with \$25,000 from the short-term and \$10,000 from the long-term Capital Improvements. We can pull the money back into the individual accounts whenever needed. This account was set up in early July 2023 and to date we have earned a total of \$857 in interest.

There is a total of \$4,400 in the Alumni checking account and \$5,000 in Capital Improvements readily available. The annual budget for the 2024 calendar year will be presented at the annual meeting for approval by the DNAA membership.

The fall golf proceeds were roughly \$4,500 and after all bills were paid, we sent more than \$950 to the TKE Active Scholarship Fund.

The DNAA holds two loan with the Property Board, one from capital improvement for \$2,900 and a short-term loan to the house of \$8,800 when it was empty in 20217. No progress has been made on the payment of these interest fee loans in 2023.

- Income \$45,910 (Golf, Dues, Scholarship and Capital Improvements Donations)
- Expenses \$29,156 (Awards, website, database, golf, flowers, postage, tax prep, social events)
- Net Income \$16,700 (sent to Capital Improvements and Scholarships)







### **Composite Update**



### **Delta Nu Housing Corporation Report**

### **Housing Report**

The Housing Corporation meets monthly to discuss contracts, track payments and collections, and discuss all other topics related to the operation of the house. All bills including taxes, mortgage payments and Insurance are paid thru Nov 2024. Our mortgage balance is now down to \$122,500 and scheduled to be paid off in 5.5 years. We have \$9,100 in AR for Spring rent and owe the DNAA \$ \$22,000 for short term loans from Capital Improvements for house repairs and payments made to keep the house when it was empty in 2017. At the December meeting, all Property Board Officers agreed to return for 2024.

The Housing Corporation offers three payment options: monthly, semester, school year.

All rental contracts are for nine months and do not include summer rental.

Option 1: \$400 a month / \$4,800 for the school year.

Option 2: Semester rent \$2,200 / \$4,400 for the school year.

Option 3: One time payment of \$4,600 due in September 2024.

New housing contracts, including these options, are out for the 2024-25 school year.

There are 14 fraters living in the house this spring, with a target of 20 house residents in 2024-025.

Happy New Year from Capital Improvements. This is an update of the goals and objectives for "CI", both long-term and short-term. First, a little primer on what Capital Improvements is all about.

The fund exists to support <u>improvements or enhancements</u> to the TKE house or property. Fraters (and others) make non-tax-deductible donations to the TKE House Capital Improvement Fund. They receive recognition of their lifetime donations achieving different levels of "brick" on The Richard W. Wiles (ΔN 365) Teke for Life Alumni Donor Wall". There are 7 levels of donors reflecting the total amount of individual lifetime donations starting at \$500. Chapter Eternal Fraters may be recognized by a donation in his name to the Memorial Wall.








### **Influential Tekes**

As TKE approaches the 125th Founders Day on Jan. 10th, 2024, TKE Headquarters is honoring 125 influential Tekes. Frater Dr. B. D. Owens (Delta-Nu, Northwest Missouri St.) made significant impacts as an educator & administrator. He became president of Northwest in 1977, the only alumnus to become president. He served TKE as Grand Pylortes & TKE Foundation Board for four years. #125in125tke

Frater B. D. Owens has made significant impacts as an educator, administrator and with TKE. With TKE, he was Grand Pylortes in 1979 and served on the TKE Foundation Board for four years. He graduated from Northwest Missouri State and entered the Air Force rising to Captain during his service. He received a PhD from the University of Pennsylvania and began teaching at Bowling Green University. He has worked on the American Council on Education grant and trained one year under President Elvis Stahr at the University of Indiana. He then became the youngest president of the University of Tampa when appointed in 1971. Owens became president of Northwest Missouri State in 1977 and, as of 2019, was the only alumnus to become president. After serving as a consultant to a Belize-based school, in 2001 he became interim president and Chief Financial Officer as the school moved to the Cayman Islands.

### Peter J. Greve TKE Alumni Scholarship

The PJG Scholarship was established in May 2008 with the goal of promoting Northwest Missouri State, TKE and the achievement of a college education.

This is a \$1,000 scholarship that will be awarded to an incoming freshman/graduating high school senior. To be eligible, applicants must have maintained a high school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above from ninth grade through the first semester of their senior year. The applicant must be an accepted entering freshman by Northwest Missouri State University and nominated by a TKE alumnus. No specific major is required.


To date the Fund has provided more than 17 \$1,000 scholarships to Northwest students that were nominated by a Delta Nu Teke, most directly related tom that Frater. If you have a son or daughter, niece or nephew attending Northwest this fall, please encourage them to apply.

Delta Nu TEKE alumni serve as evaluators and will review student transcripts, supporting information, and recommendation letters in their deliberations. As monies allow, several scholarships can be awarded. Applications are due annually on February 1, 2024, for the 2024-2025 school year.

### **Delta Nu AA Membership Report**

Our current membership stands at 207 with 27 Lifetime members, 15 deceased and 66 expired memberships.

I can't control how many alumni join the DNAA or participate in our social events, but I can control my effort. These efforts should influence the results. Be mindful of the short-term and long-term impacts - A year is enough time to make a lot of things happen. But at the same time, we also tend to overestimate what we can achieve in a year. I started this journey with the DNAA in 2008, and fifteen years later, I feel that things are falling into place a little bit more every year. No one can make a big impact by doing something for a week or a month. Mastering skills, building knowledge, and building relationships take time. A long time.
